

Responsible Arrival Checklist

Leaders:

- Label all equipment that your fire brigade is bringing to camp.
- Remind young participants to label all items they bring to camp (name + fire brigade).
Labelled lost property is much more likely to find its way back to its owner.
- Read through the arrival instructions in Camp Letters 4 and 5 once more.
- Arrival processing may take some time, so make sure everyone has a restroom break before arriving.
- Ensure that you have all required documents ready.
- Report any changes in personnel or participants at the registration point.
- The arrival package contains important camp materials, so take very good care of it.
- Distribute wristbands according to the instructions.

Camp Participants:

- Make sure the most important items are packed in your backpack and easily accessible, for example: water bottle, hat, eating utensils, work gloves for pitching tents, etc.
- Pack according to the weather forecast and be prepared for both sunshine and rain.
- Bring snacks and drinks for the journey, arrival process, and tent setup.
- Follow the schedules and instructions provided, and remember that patience is a virtue.
- Take restroom breaks during the journey – more often rather than less.
- Tune your radio to frequency XX.X or tune in to an internet radio station on the way to camp to get into the camp spirit before you arrive.
- A positive camp spirit is contagious, and everyone contributes to the atmosphere through their actions.
- Work together with other fire brigades and campers. There is strength in cooperation!
- If you need help, do not hesitate to ask.
- Once your tent area is ready, conduct a safety walk with your unit.
- Let's work together to make this the best fire brigade youth camp ever.



Responsible Departure Checklist

- Follow the instructions and schedules provided; the journey home should also take place in an organized manner.
- Make sure you get enough rest before departure, especially if you are a driver.
- Stay hydrated and dress appropriately for the weather during camp breakdown as well.
- Protect equipment during dismantling, especially in poor weather conditions.
- Secure your load safely. Remember that road traffic laws apply to firefighters too.
- Ensure that at least your own tent area is cleaned thoroughly before you leave.
- Take care of your fellow fire brigade members and be considerate of other campers as well.
- Ask for help when needed and help others whenever you can – there is strength in cooperation!
- Make sure essential items are packed in your backpack and easily accessible, such as: a water bottle, hat, snacks, charger, power bank, etc.
- Remember that other campers also want to get home, so patience is important here too.
- If you have extra time on departure day, use it to enjoy the camp one last time.
- Departure day is also a good opportunity to say goodbye to new friends.
- Take sufficient breaks during the journey home, including meal breaks.
- Camp has been an amazing experience for everyone. Make sure to bring this adventure to a memorable and fitting close.
